Evidence of Coverage (EOC), Annual Notice of Change (ANOC), Summary of
Benefits (SB)

This is important information on changes in your coverage.

This notice is to let you know about changes to your 2023 Medicare Advantage benefits that take effect during the year. The changes are part of the member cost sharing protections provided under the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA). If you use Part B drug benefit, you will see lower cost sharing for certain drugs as described below. This Addendum is attached to your plan’s EOC, ANOC and SB which are posted on our website.

Medicare Part B prescription drugs	4/1/2023	<p>Certain Part B rebatable drugs may be subject to a lower coinsurance than the amount shown on your plan document.</p> <p>The list of Part B rebatable drugs that are subject to a lower coinsurance is published by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and may change quarterly.</p>	<p>You pay less for certain Part B rebatable drugs.</p> <p>If you are eligible for full Medicare cost sharing assistance under Medicaid, you will continue to pay \$0 copayment amount.</p>
Insulin furnished under Part B through an item of durable medical equipment (i.e. a medically necessary traditional insulin pump)	7/1/2023	<p>Insulin cost sharing is subject to a coinsurance cap of \$35 for one-month’s supply of insulin.</p> <p>If your plan has a plan deductible, it does not apply to Part B insulin.</p>	<p>You pay no more than \$35 for one-month’s supply of insulin.</p> <p>If you are eligible for full Medicare cost sharing assistance under Medicaid, you will continue to pay \$0 copayment amount.</p>
